CERTIFIED FIRMS PROGRAM

LINXS Certified Firms team helps certified firms connect with the Automated People Mover (APM) project and learn about current procurement opportunities. The team offers certification assistance and provides firms with additional business and training resources.

Monthly newsletters are sent to the certified firm community with construction updates and upcoming scopes of work. In addition to these newsletters, the LINXS Certified Firms team is curating and sending weekly email updates with the latest COVID-19 resources to assist small businesses during this time.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

LINXS Workforce Development team will conduct weekly Construction Career Opportunities information sessions to bring awareness to job seekers about employment possibilities on the APM project. These orientations cover the employment process and how to apply for trade unions and pre-apprenticeship programs. Interested participants will be invited to a one-on-one Pathway Plan session where they will be provided with information on Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) programs and unions to begin the application process.

The LINXS Workforce Development team has developed a virtual intake process for union members and those seeking sponsorship. This week, online platforms are being tested to perform virtual orientations and Pathway Plan sessions for those interested in starting a construction career on the APM project. YOUTH ENGAGEMENT

LINXS Youth Engagement team has been working with many of our community partners to take on the challenge of educating online. On Friday, March 27th, Rosa Parks Elementary in Lynwood, California, hosted their first annual virtual career day and posted several videos highlighting various careers on the school's Facebook page for students to view while at home with their parents. During this presentation, LINXS Youth Engagement presented the importance of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) and how it requires students to think creatively as they identify and solve challenges in a real-world context.

The LINXS Youth Engagement Coordinator has also participated in many STEM Beyond School webinar series, to help enhance our team's knowledge and STEM lesson plans. ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Automated People Mover (APM) system will bring convenience and time-certainty for guests traveling to or from LAX. During peak hours, driverless trains will arrive at stations every two minutes. The trains will have wide doors for easy access with luggage, large windows for viewing, plenty of hand holds, and seats for those in need. Station platforms are open-air, light-filled and have escalators and elevators quick, convenient access to the terminals. The APM is the centerpiece of the Landside Access Modernization Program (LAMP), which also includes a Consolidated Rent-A-Car (ConRAC) facility, Intermodal Transportation Facilities, and associated roadway improvements. The APM will reduce vehicle congestion in the Central Terminal Area, provide a connection with L.A. Metro's regional transportation system, create new locations for passenger pick-up and drop-off, reduce emissions, and provide reliable access to the terminals.

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
